The Global CCS Institute hosted the President of the Republic of Hungary, His Excellency Mr László Sólyom earlier this week at its head office in Canberra.

CEO Nick Otter outlined to President Sólyom the Global CCS Institute's role in supporting the G8 recommendation to deploy 20 large scale CCS demonstration projects by 2020.

Mr Otter also highlighted the importance of CCS as a viable approach in the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions whilst moving towards a low-carbon economy.

The International Energy Agency forecasts that global energy generation will continue to grow and the reliance on fossil fuels will remain a significant part of the energy mix till 2030 further intensifies the need for acceleration and commercial deployment of CCS technologies. President Sólyom has long been an advocate of clean energy technologies and used his State Visit to Australia to meet with the Global CCS Institute.

Meeting with President Sólyom was an opportunity to build on international relationships and to broaden the global understanding and acceptance of CCS.
