Status of CCS: Report findings

The Global CCS Institute has undertaken a comprehensive audit of the world's current CCS projects which has determined: project status; the costs involved with CCS; the impact of the global financial crisis; policy and regulatory frameworks; research and development efforts and commercial and non-commercial gaps in the global deployment of CCS.

This global assessment has established a comprehensive reference point for the international community in the current economic climate. Key findings will be presented.

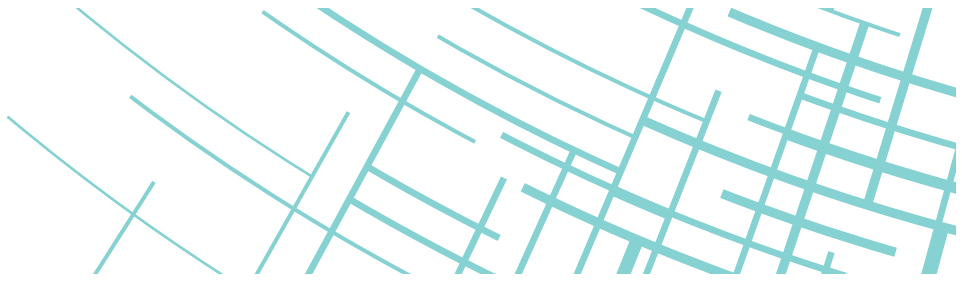

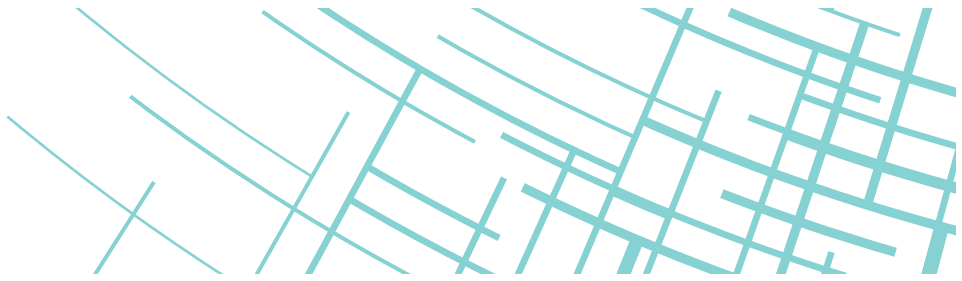

Capacity Building

The Global CCS Institute is working in partnership with a range of organisations and multilateral fora including the International Energy Agency (IEA), the Asia Development Bank (ABD) and the Carbon Sequestration Leadership Forum (CSLF) to fund and implement capacity building activities. Other work program activities including CCS Ready

As part of its initial work program, the Global CCS Institute is working collaboratively with industry, governments, international policy bodies and key strategic partners to build capability and capacity around CCS, globally.

Projects currently underway aim to elevate CCS as a global issues by supporting:

- development of country specific CCS roadmaps;
- characterisation of geological storage sites;
- advancement of early mover projects; and
- consortium building.

The Global CCS Institute is also supporting a global dialogue on CCS Ready. This work is developing an internationally accepted definition of CCS Ready and best practice guidelines to increase the capacity of governments and industry to assess the regulatory, financial and technical aspects of CCS Ready.
